If you're based in South Africa or Nigeria and you're between the ages of 21 and 25 with a matric or secondary school

certificate, you can apply to be part of the fellowship.

Applicants must be able to house themselves in Johannesburg or Lagos for the duration of the program.

## What do you have to do?

Send a two to three-minute video explaining what makes you a Global Citizen, what role you believe young people play in ending extreme poverty, and what social issues you are taking action on. If you prefer writing, you can send a 500- to 700-word essay answering the same questions.

Email your application to <u>fellowship@globalcitizen.org</u> and include a copy of your ID or passport. Applicants from minorities and underrepresented communities are strongly encouraged to apply.
