

Litha drives Environmental Affairs' green road show

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Following the successful management of the Department of Environmental Affairs' first Waste Management Conference in September, Litha Communications was appointed to help the Department take their 'green' show on the road.

"The national road show will visit all nine provinces to promote and popularise the Waste Act. The road shows kicked off on 28 October in Mangaung in the Free State and will end on 9 December in the Northern Cape.
