

Transnet hit by cyberattack - Operations disrupted nationwide

The Transnet Port Terminals website has been hacked, implying that all companies under Transnet have been affected. All Transnet websites were down at the time when reporting was done for <u>this SA Trucker</u> article. The publication cited sources who requested to remain anonymous because they are not allowed to speak to the media.



ISS Global Forwarding also announced on Twitter that it received information about Transnet being hacked.

Newsflash: Transnet Systems Offline.

The South African Association of Freight Forwarders said that the Transnet Freight Rail system was also hacked, bringing operations to a halt nationwide.

A source at the Durban port spoke to *Reuters*, saying: "We were told it's a cyberattack. The terminals can't work, we can't load or unload anything. This is going to impact the business badly."

This photo was sent to *SA Trucker* by a trucker who reported that they are stuck at the Durban Container Terminal, showing Transnet's kiosks displaying an error message:



Transnet said its freight rail, pipelines, engineering and property divisions were reporting normal activity, Transnet said. This is a developing story.
